YEAR R ADVENT 2 2020

TOPIC: Light and Dark

Areas of Learning	This term we will be learning
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Communication and Language	The children will continue to develop their communication and language skills in all areas of their learning. They will learn to listen to stories with increasing attention and recall and join in with repeated refrains in stories and rhymes.
Communicate	Through talk, children will extend their vocabulary by exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.
	<u>To help at home</u> : Encourage your child to talk to you in full sentences, rather than one word answers to help develop their vocabulary.
	The children will continue to develop their fine motor skills through the use of handwriting patterns, scissor skills, threading, and patterns.
Physical Development	Children will continue to practice doing up buttons and zips when putting their coats on and putting on their gloves independently.
	We will use construction materials such as building blocks to build and make objects on different scales.
	In PE the children will continue to develop their balls skills with Mr Walker.
	To help at home: Encourage your child with their independent skills for example
	doing up zips on jackets and putting on gloves.
	Linked to RE, our main topic is 'Advent'.
Personal, Social and	During circle time children will have the opportunity to talk, listen, ask questions,
Emotional	and contribute their own feelings and ideas to the group. We will continue to
Development	develop the children's ability to share and take turns.
	We will talk about our morning and bedtime routines, including the importance of cleaning, washing and looking after yourself. We will share our own experiences of Christmas, birthdays and other events that are special to us.
	To help at home: Talk with your child about how your family prepares and celebrates Christmas.
	We will be reading a variety of picture books linked to our topic, 'Light and Dark'.
Literacy	The children will orally sequence different parts of stories and act out stories through role play.
	We will read stories related to Christmas and together make Christmas lists and Christmas cards.
	The children will continue to learn the sounds letters make (phonics) and learn to read simple words. They will develop their pencil control, by focusing on letter formation and writing their name correctly.
	To help at home: Continue to read and share a range of stories with your child. Talk about the pictures and what might happen next. Ask your child about their favourite part of the story.

	In reception, number is used in all areas of learning.
Mathematics	The children will continue to learn to count and recognise numbers up to 10 and then to 20 by singing number rhymes, chanting and counting. They will continue to count objects making sure they say one number for each object. They will estimate and compare groups of objects using vocabulary such as more and less. The children will sort sets of animals, play people, shapes and other classroom objects by size. They will learn about the different times of the day and sequence pictures of our day and night routines. They will use 2D and 3D shapes to create shape pictures and repeating patterns. They will also sort shapes according to their properties, for example curved and straight sides.
	To help at home: Encourage your child to recognise numbers when out and about e.g. car registrations. Ask your child what one more or one less would be than a given number.
Understanding the World	Topic work will be all about 'Light and Dark'. As part of the topic we will be learning about nocturnal animals. We will read together fiction and non-fiction books relating to them. We will explore materials that can be seen in the dark and use these to make collages. We will find out about Christmas traditions and explore how other people around
	the world celebrate Christmas. <u>To help at home</u> : Talk about daily routines, including the importance of bedtime routines.
Expressive Arts and Design	The children will make a variety of pictures based on light and dark. They will create silhouette paintings and they will mix colours to create light and dark tones. They will spend time this term designing and making Christmas cards, calendars and decorations for our Christmas tree, using a variety of different media. Together we will sing Christmas carols and we will choose percussion instruments to go with our songs.
20	To help at home: We will send home the words to Christmas carols that we will learn in school to practise at home together.
Religious Education	This term RE focuses on Advent and Christmas. We will begin by looking at what a birthday is and why we celebrate birthdays. We will learn about Advent and looking forward to Christmas, the birthday of Jesus. The children will listen to the Nativity story and complete activities around this theme.
	To help at home: We will introduce the Hail Mary this half term. Please say this prayer at home with your families to help children become familiar with it.
