Science
Electricity and Animals
including humans



In science this half term we are looking at electricity; associating the brightness of the bulb or the volume of a buzzer with the voltage of the cells in a circuit. During Advent we will also be studying Animals including humans where the children will learn about the circulatory system and its function within our bodies.

New Beginnings.

Children will look at new beginnings in the context of their own experiences and consider their feelings and the feelings of other when affected by change and difference. Artwork and role play will help children express their thoughts and feelings within a safe secure environment. The children will be taught how to identify their worth as individuals through positive things about themselves and their achievements, seeing their mistakes, making amends and setting personal goals; to face new challenges positively by collecting information, looking for help, making responsible choices and taking action why and how rules and laws are made and enforced, why different rules are needed in different situations and how to take part in making and changing rules. Talk to your family about how you feel and discuss strategies to make you feel more confident about concerns you may have.



Topic
Vikings and The Water Cycle



Vikings—who were they and why they invaded England. Looking at Viking Long boats and the designs that have made them well known today; as well as the Viking and Anglo- Saxons struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor. Art and DT will be included within the topic, with children creating their own Viking shields.

Will you ever see the water you drink? The children will be investigating the water cycle and why water is a necessity, We will be looking at countries with the most and least waterfall. Suggested activities to help with at home:

Computing

The children in Year 6 will be looking at improving their art and design techniques. They will be using their sketching skills to develop their fonts in art and then taking them further by designing them on the computer. This will take the children through the process from start to finish.

Y6 will begin the term learning the skills of out door games. They will use a number of different techniques to pass, dribble and shoot; play games confidently; control the ball consistently; use a range of tactics in attack and defence; carry out thorough, effective warm-up activities, concentrating on exercises that help their play; adapt these activities and exercises to meet their own needs; explain what is more or less effective in the games played; make changes that improve their team and individual performance.
